Edward Manzo Writes Comprehensive Guide to the America Invents Act for Patent Attorneys

Thomson Reuters publishes book by Husch Blackwell attorney covering ‘every significant aspect of the AIA’

Husch Blackwell Partner Edward D. Manzo has authored a new book entitled, *The America Invents Act: A Guide to Patent Litigation & Patent Procedure*.

Intended as a desk reference for patent practitioners and patent litigators, it is a comprehensive guide through the changes made by the America Invents Act, including two chapters that specifically detail new case law. The preface is written by The Hon. James F. Holderman, Chief Judge of the U.S. District Court, Northern District of Illinois.

Manzo was approached by publisher Thomson Reuters to write the book and spent several months of 2012 working on it. “At roughly 800 pages, it substantially covers the congressional intent for every significant aspect of the AIA, including background context and relevant source material,” he said. “It’s all to help others understand the statute and get a better feel for what’s changing and why.” Manzo plans to supplement the book annually to cover important case rulings on AIA revisions and further developments. The book is available for purchase online from Thomson Reuters.
