Former U.S. Prosecutor Mark Grider Joins Husch Blackwell Washington D.C. Office

As an Assistant U.S. Attorney, Grider was a member of the Department of Justice Medicare Task Force, coordinating civil/criminal proceedings in an effort to save and recover government funds. He led investigations into corporate healthcare fraud and also managed False Claim Act cases, assisting in over \$5 million in civil settlement negotiations with major corporate hospitals.

Later, as deputy compliance officer of a national healthcare company, Grider managed a corporate compliance group responsible for reporting fact-finding and analysis on enterprise-wide compliance risk issues, including anti-kickback statute risk, billing and False Claims Act risk, and CIA-related matters.

Grider received his J.D. from the University of Missouri School of Law (1998) and his B.A. *magna cum laude* from Truman State University (1995).
