Russ Orban Receives Small Business Council Special Appreciation Award

Orban also served as lead counsel for the reauthorization of the government's highly successful Small Business Innovation Research program in 1992, which doubled the size of the program and benefited thousands of small, high-tech businesses.

Orban recently joined the firm's Washington, D.C., office as Of Counsel and concentrates his work in the areas of Governmental Affairs and Government Contracts law.
