Matthew Schelp Confirmed by U.S. Senate to District Court Judgeship

Husch Blackwell partner Matthew Schelp was confirmed today in a predominantly bipartisan vote to serve as a judge for the U.S. District Court, Eastern District of Missouri. President Donald Trump nominated Schelp for the judgeship on November 6, 2019.

Based in Husch Blackwell's St. Louis office, Schelp is a key partner in the firm's Government Solutions practice group, where he focuses on government compliance, internal investigations, whistleblower defense, white collar defense, Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) litigation, securities enforcement and business litigation.
