OVERVIEW

During his time with the Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH), he assisted in drafting key regulatory provisions affecting healthcare providers and also played a key role in crafting the state's COVID-19 vaccine mandate requirement. He represented administrative offices and units within the Department across a broad range of issues, including the many emergency regulations enacted pursuant to the state of emergency declared due to the pandemic. Relative to COVID-19 specifically, as part of the Task Force established by Rhode Island Governor Gina Raimondo, Morgan provided legal assistance in the drafting of emergency regulations and executive orders and the enforcement thereof, including administrative proceedings relative to issuance of citations and compliance orders, as well as litigation in Superior Court.

Morgan routinely counsels clients with regard to regulatory compliance, government investigations, and more day-to-day operational issues such as licensure requirements, professional misconduct, and medical staff management.
