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Husch Blackwell's Grasz Nominated for Federal Judgeship

Husch Blackwell's Steve Grasz was nominated by the Trump administration yesterday to serve as a Circuit Judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit.

Grasz is a 1989 graduate, *cum laude*, of the University of Nebraska College of Law. He holds a B.S. from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, *cum laude*, graduating from the school's Agriculture Honors Program.

Grasz's nomination marks the second time within a month that the current administration has tapped a Husch Blackwell lawyer to fill a high-profile post.
